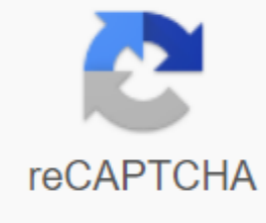

Therefore, the transfer acceptance rate for the University of Florida is 47.02%. This indicates how difficult it is to transfer to the University of Florida.
